Ladies and Gentlemen:

Enclosed is the Parma Municipal Court's Annual Report for 1995 which is being submitted in my capacity as Presiding Judge, for the year ending December 31, 1995, pursuant to statute, for the information of all persons interested in the operation of Ohio's largest suburban Municipal Court District.

The Parma Municipal Court has been located for a substantial period of time in totally inadequate premises which do not comply with Ohio Revised Code - Rules of Superintendence For Municipal Courts and County Courts, Rule 17. Further the building does not meet with standards and codes governing public buildings. Previous efforts to construct a Justice Center facility housing the Court and Police Station have been unsuccessful.

The health, safety and welfare of court personnel, users of court services, litigants (both civil and criminal) and Judges mandated a judicial order requiring proper and suitable facilities for the Court be issued.

A copy of that order is presented herein.

## THE PARMA MUNICIPAL COURT PARMA, OHIO

JOURNAL ENTRY

It is imperative in the Administration of Justice that a suitable structure be provided for the daily operation of the Parma Municipal Court. The current structure located at 5750 West 54th Street, substantially impedes the administration of justice in the Parma Municipal Court district.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that facilities be provided in compliance with the Ohio Revised Code - Rules of Superintendence For Municipal Courts and County Courts, Rule 17, attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully rewritten. See Exhibit "A".

That a detailed plan to provide a structure compliant with the aforementioned rules for the daily operations of the Parma Municipal Court be submitted to the Presiding and Administrative Judge of the Parma Municipal Court by December 2, 1996. Said plan shall include, but not be limited to: site selection / location, architectural space study, drawings, plans and specifications, all applicable engineering drawings, project management plan, costs, financing, and construction schedule.

It is further ordered that the facility shall be ready for use and occupancy by the Court no later than May 31, 1997. Any person, group of persons, entity, organizations, corporations or governmental agencies causing a deviation from this order shall be subject to the contempt powers of the this Court.

IT IS SO ORDERED.

#### INDIGENT COUNSEL

As a result of the United States Supreme Court Decision in the <a href="Argersinger">Argersinger</a> case, legal representation must be provided, without charge, to all indigent persons accused of certain crimes.

The Parma City Council, in 1974, passed Ordinance No. 192-74 providing for payment of indigent legal representation. Attorney James W. Burke, Jr., was contracted to act as Indigent Counsel.
